TONIGHT'S GAME

BRUINS at SABRES

- This is the first of four meetings between the Sabres and Bruins this season.
- Last meeting: Buffalo defeated Boston 4-1 in Buffalo on Feb. 25
- Next meeting: Sunday, Dec. 16 in Boston
- The Sabres are 3-5-2 in their last 10 games vs. the Bruins; 3-5-2 at home.
- This is the 290th game all-time between Buffalo and Boston; Buffalo has a 124-121-44 series record.
- The Sabres are 74-49-23 at home against the Bruins all-time.

THIS DAY IN SABRES HISTORY

- The Sabres are 1-4-1 all-time on October 4.
- **October 4, 1991:** Brad May scores his first NHL goal on his first NHL shot in his debut, a 5-4 loss vs. Pittsburgh.

THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Buffalo opens the season tonight with the first game of a four-game home stand. The four games mark the longest home stretch to open a season in franchise history. The previous longest was three games (1975-76 and 2015-16).
- The Sabres have won both of their last two games against the Bruins; a win tonight would give them wins in three straight meetings for the first time since they won four in a row from Dec. 15, 2010 to March 10, 2011.
- The Sabres are also seeking wins in consecutive visits from the Bruins for the first time since Dec. 19, 2013 and Feb. 26, 2014.
- **Kyle Okposo** has 25 points (7+18) in 31 career games against Boston, including 16 points (6+10) in the last 16 matchups.
- **Evan Rodrigues** posted three points (1+2) in his first three career games against the Bruins last season.
- **Vladimir Sobotka** enters the season ranked sixth among all qualifying active NHL players with a career faceoff percentage of 56.0 percent.

OPENING NIGHT

- Tonight marks the 48th season-opener in franchise history.
- The Sabres are 24-18-5 all-time in season-openers; 17-9-5 when opening at home.
- Buffalo is 21-19-7 all-time in home-openers.
- The Sabres have previously opened their season against the Bruins twice, including a 5-3 win at Boston on Oct. 7, 1993 and a 9-5 win at Buffalo Memorial Auditorium on Oct. 10, 1974. The team's nine goals in the 1974 game marked the Sabres' best output in a season-opener.

CAPTAIN JACK

- After being named captain yesterday, **Jack Eichel** becomes the 19th full-season captain in franchise history and the 28th player to wear the captain's "C" for at least a one-month period for the Sabres.
- At 21 years of age, **Eichel** becomes the youngest captain in Sabres history, passing Jim Schoenfeld, who served as the team's captain as a 23-year-old in the 1975-76 season.

Head Coach: Phil Housley

Phil Housley enters his second season behind the bench for the Sabres after completing his first season as an NHL head coach in 2017-18. The Hockey Hall of Famer and former Sabres defenseman is the 18th head coach in Buffalo's franchise history and the seventh alumnus to serve as the team's head coach.

Housley joined the Sabres after helping to guide the Nashville Predators to their first Stanley Cup Final appearance in franchise history. Named an assistant coach on May 22, 2013, Housley was a driving force behind one of the NHL's best defensive groups throughout his tenure.
